WOOL:


KILIM RUGS

Just a few decades ago, Fowa used to the be the hub for kilim weaving and home to thousands of workshops. AOW works with an export-ready enterprise that is working hard to compete with machine-made rugs and reviving this tradition, to put this area back on the local and international map for authentic handwoven kilim rugs and craftsmanship. 
CUPS, TUMBLERS, CARAFES, PLATES, BOWLS, VASES

Surprisingly, there are only around 10 master glass-blowers left in Egypt. Fortunately, there are still a few Fair Trade, export-ready suppliers of glassware sustaining a technique that dates back to the fifth dynasty. Handblown glassware is made from recycled glass bottles and the design options are vast. Egypt offers an array of cups, tumblers, water pitchers, carafes, plates, bowls, and vases. Glass is offered in a wide array of colors from a smokey grey to marbleized pastels.











STONE:

CANDLE HOLDERS, TABLETOP, LIGHTING

Egypt is a country rich in stone including limestone (for a snow white flaky crystal look), alabaster (for a white and white stripe translucent look), granite (offered in dark grey, light grey, white, green, caramel, beige and black) and salt for a more textured, organic appeal. Alabaster is particularly malleable and gorgeous as the white stone is translucent, creating unique lighting pendants and candle holders, warming any environment. All of these white stones are particularly unique when mixed with copper and wood. Alabaster products are often made with the help of machinery, whereas limestone is often hand carved.



















BED THROWS, TOWELS



The most common towels you might see from Egypt are the futtah woven towels, commonly with chic stripes. Double layer towels are also available (one side is terry cloth, one side woven). The thickness, quality, softness, and durability sell themeselves. Embroidered bedspreads also caught our eye but please note, they can take around one month to make or there could be a maximum capacity of 20 per month due to the time required to embroider. These hand-embroidered bed coverings are the most time-consuming item but they also pass through the most hands; therefore they have the biggest impact on the artisans: Siwan women from the Western desert of Egypt (Sahara).







METALS:

CANDLE HOLDERS, LIGHTING, TABLEWARE

Egypt is extremely innovative when it comes to mixing materials. The mix of alabaster and brass is particularly beautiful when used to make candle holders, tableware and lighting. Egypt offers experienced exporters of these brass and copper products very loyal and determined producers.
